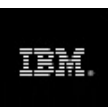

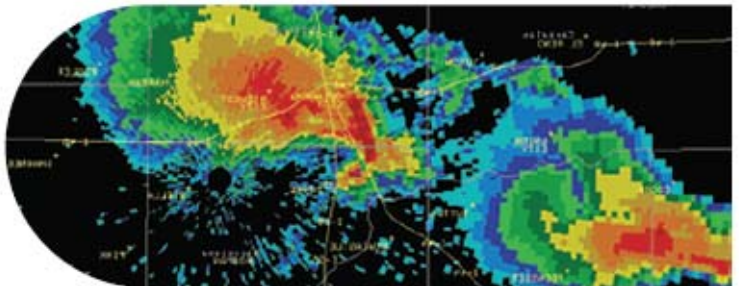

BDPA YCTP Instructor Named IBM Master Inventor

▶▶ ROCHESTER, MN (BDPA) -- Zachary Garbow has been the reigning Technical Director of BDPA-Southern Minnesota's Youth Computer Training Program (YCTP) for the last two YCTP sessions. He is a tireless worker and a "gifted" educator. When he took over in 2005 YCTP was averaging about 12 to 15 students per Saturday session. This year that average has jumped to 31 students. Student age ranges are 12 to 21 and their grade ranges are 7th through 12th. This year YCTP has 4 students who are in the 7th grade and 5 who are in the 12th grade. The rest are in the 8th to 11th grade range. At least 75% of the 31 students who attend YCTP sessions are proficient in creating web pages and extracting data from SQL databases via PHP. BDPA expects up to 10 of these kids to receive their High School Credits in Computer Science, based on criteria developed with The Rochester Public School System.

In May, Zachary Garbow was named an IBM Master Inventor. At the age of 26, Garbow has become the youngest person to hold the title of Master Inventor in the history of IBM. After joining IBM in 2003, he immediately became involved in the patent process as an inventor, mentor to other new inventors, member of two invention review boards, and presenter on creativity and the patent process. In the last 4 years he has over 60 IBM patents pending applications in the US Patent Office.

An appointment to the position of Master Inventor is based on the candidate's individual achievement in patent activity and invention leadership and the need for a Master Inventor within each area of technology. Each IBM division has its own Master Inventor criteria, but they all have common attributes. The criteria that must be met for appointment to all IBM eServer xSeries or IntelliStation Master Inventor position follows:

- **Significant, Sustained, and Current Patent Activity**
The candidate must have at least 5 patent plateaus (60 invention points) with a minimum of 10 filed patent applications. Consideration is given to patent-related awards and to the business impact of the inventions.
- **Patent Leadership and Business Need**
The candidate must demonstrate significant service in patent-related activities. Factors taken into consideration are identifying patentable ideas, advocating the filing of invention disclosures, participating on Invention Review Boards, supporting the Intellectual Property Law team, and being a mentor to other inventors. Master Inventors are appointed within a framework of need. Each key technology area usually has one Master Inventor at a time.

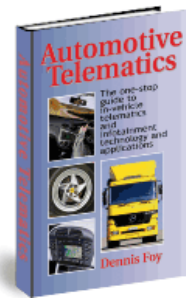

JEF and BDPA Students Make a Big Splash in Madison at TeraGrid 2007

Madison, WI (JEF) -- JEF students have been well received at both TeraGrid conferences. They have also left both with honors. At TeraGrid 2006, one college student from JEF competed in the Cyber Infrastructure Impact (CI-Impact) competition. That student Bryan Bemley, a second year computer science major at Bowie State University submitted a poster, which the judges said, was exactly what they wanted. Needless to say he won the competition and received an all expense paid trip to the Supercomputer conference (SC06) in Tampa, FL. A winner in a competition is not allowed to compete in that same event the following year.

TeraGrid 2007 was held June 4-8 on the campus of the University of Wisconsin Madison campus. This year there were four JEF students competing in two competitions, Cyber Infrastructure Impact and Advancing Scientific Discovery (ASD). Christian Loggins was the only high school student and the rest were college students. He and Eric Lamison-White were on-site at the conference.

CI-Impact competition has two components high school and college. Loggins received 2nd place for the high school component. Eric received 2nd place and Jessye Bemley received 1st place in the college component. Jessye was off-site in an NSF Research for Undergraduates (REU) Industrial Engineering internship at Auburn University. The judges interviewed her remotely. Jessye is a senior industrial engineering major at North Carolina A&T State University.

The ASD competition is team-based. A team can have a maximum of five members. The JEF Researchers were Christian and Eric on-site and Bryan Bemley, a third year computer science major at Bowie State University, was off-site at the Arctic region Supercomputer Center at the University of Alaska at Fairbanks. Bryan was communicating remotely with his team members. The JEF Researchers placed 2nd in the ASD competition. The teams had to solve eight problems that were specific to each of the eight portals/gateways in the TeraGrid. The competition started at 4:00pm Monday, June 4 and ended at 8:30 am Tuesday, June 5, 2007. The awards were presented at the TeraGrid Town Hall meeting last month, Thursday morning, June 7, 2007. **JEF**

▶▶ **Washington, D.C. (BETF)** – On June 16, 2007 at Howard University's School of Business, five teams competed in the 2007 Northeast Regional High School Computer Competition (HSCC). The teams came from Hartford, CT (2 teams), New Jersey, and Washington D.C. (2 teams) BDPA chapters. Rigorous competition lasted 8 hours and was divided into three distinct categories - team oral questioning, individual written/computerized examination, and application development. Washington D.C. Team 2 took 1st place, while Washington D.C. Team-1 and Hartford Team-1 took 2nd and 3rd place respectively. Although first, second, and third place teams were recognized, everyone was a winner in this year's competition. Students and trainers left the competition knowing which areas they need to improve upon as they make the final preparations for the National HSCC next month here in Washington.

The Washington, D.C. Chapter of BDPA thanks Dr. Narendra Rustagi, Chairman of Department of Information Systems & Decision Analysis, Dr. Charles Ermer, Acting Chairman and Professor, Professor Gerald Peppers, Past President BDPA-DC, and Mrs. Nash, Director of CISCAP for their help in allowing the Northeast Regional HSCC to take place on the campus of Howard University.
